This year our team chose the following scripture as the focus for our school.


"...For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago." Ephesians 2:10.


Our goal is to not only provide academic excellence, but to reassure children of God's promises and remind them they are perfect in His image. This fall we show-cased Family History projects to reinforce the importance of connections through the generations and the unique traits of each other.

Over the past 10 years (since the building addition), our school has steadily grown in enrollment from 174 to 206 students; that's an 18% increase— what a blessing! Our school has worked in partnership with the church to develop stronger relationships between the two entities of church and school and we are reinstating a property board to support our facilities.

Many facility upgrades are also happening at both locations. Through donations, Childcare Grants and our Fund-A-Need, five of our classrooms on the lower level will have built in cabinetry installed this spring from St. Croix Valley Cabinetry. A Grant to support private schools during the pandemic provided new technology in upper grade classrooms. Additionally, the Childcare Counts Grant has supported both of our early childhood programs with funds for a remodeled playground at East Campus, and new tables and classroom materials at our West Campus. New initiatives this year will be to focus on social studies & health curriculum, updating technology for the entire school, adding on an All Day 3Yr Old Class, and providing opportunities for students & staff to grow in their faith.

The 3 graphs presented are the results of our Fall 2022 IOWA Basics assessment. 88% of our students in grades 1-2 are scoring at or above the 50% nationwide on the core composite. 84% of our 3rd-5th graders are scoring at or above the 50% on the complete composite, and 76% of our 6th are scoring at or above the 50% on the complete composite.

The complete composite includes all the core subjects reading, written expression, conventions of writing, vocabulary, mathematics, computation along with social studies and science. Standardized assessments are just a snapshot of a child's academic performance and one of the multitude of assessments we use to measure academic achievement and growth in our students.
